Greetings!

The past month has been remarkable for us in terms of our work in different cities across the nation. The visit of a high level delegation from Melaka, led by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Melaka to our Delhi office added a feather in our cap.

We have conducted the first city level dialogue in Rajkot under the CapaCITIES project which is supported by Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation. The dialogue was aimed at creating awareness on low carbon and climate resilient city development, and witnessed active participation from around 60 stakeholders from diverse backgrounds.

Under the INTERACT-Bio project we organised the first stakeholder consultation in Kochi. This event was attended by over 90 stakeholders and saw active participation in the group work and discussions. A dialogue with school children in Kochi has also been initiated to communicate the significance of biodiversity conservation. A series of activities are planned with schools in this regard.

The Asia LEDS Partnership (ALP) Secretariat participated in the 'NDC Dialogue' organised by the Ministry of Mahaweli Development and Environment, Government of Sri Lanka in collaboration with United Nations Environment Programme, Global Environmental Facility and the ALP. This helped the LEDS GP and the ALP to understand the status of NDC implementation in Sri Lanka better, for future technical assistance.

In addition, preparations for the Asia LEDS Forum 2017 – 'Catalyzing Support for NDC Implementation in Asia' (5th-6th of December) and the 3rd Asia-Pacific Forum on Urban Resilience and Adaptation - Resilient Cities Asia Pacific Congress 2017 (RCAP 2017) (7th-8th of December) are in full swing. We look forward to seeing several of you at Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam in December.

We are also very pleased to announce the newly elected Regional Executive Committee (REXCom) for ICLEI South Asia. We have five proud elected members from different countries in the region now, as well as three very active advisors to the REXCom and look forward to working under their guidance.

First City Level Dialogue in Rajkot as Part of CapaCITIES Project

The first City Level Dialogue in Rajkot was organised as part of the CapaCITIES project. The aim of the dialogue was to create awareness on low carbon and climate resilient city development, provide an opportunity to discuss existing urbanisation challenges and identify possible solutions. The workshop offered a unique platform to discuss and showcase various initiatives already being undertaken by Rajkot Municipal Corporation, and understand the potential of various mitigation and adaptation related interventions for Rajkot.

Communicating Biodiversity Conservation in Schools of Kochi

As part of the INTERACT-Bio project, funded by the Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation, Building and Nuclear Safety (BMUB), an initiative has been commenced to communicate biodiversity conservation with school children in Kochi, Kerala. A set of activities - presentation on global biodiversity hotspots and significance of biodiversity, quiz competition, inter-school drawing and bio-craft competitions and development of school biodiversity registers, have been planned for the participating schools. ICLEI South Asia also participated in an awareness generation event for school teachers in Kochi, organised by Kerala State Biodiversity Board. In the event, ICLEI South Asia expressed willingness to support schools in developing school biodiversity registers by extending technical support to schools.

Under the INTERACT-Bio project, a stakeholder consultation was organised in Kochi by ICLEI South Asia, with support from Kochi Municipal Corporation. The one-day consultation identified how the project could impact the city through interventions with a strong biodiversity focus, ultimately tying into essential services provided and how horizontal and vertical integration for effective management of natural resources could be achieved.

Source Segregation Initiated Successfully in Two Wards in Udaipur under the CapaCITIES Project

As part of the CapaCITIES project, supported by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, ICLEI South Asia along with other partners initiated source segregation of waste in two wards in Udaipur. In a bid to improve the existing municipal solid waste management practices in the city, Udaipur Municipal Corporation aims to introduce and institutionalise the process of collection and transportation of segregated waste in the city to meet the provisions of Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 and also the larger goals of the Swachh Bharat Mission.

United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and ICLEI South Asia signed a Small Scale Funding Agreement with the objective of developing a holistic waste management strategy for Varanasi. Two-day meeting with city officials, private operators and other stakeholders along with officials from UNEP, Institute for Global Environmental Strategies and ICLEI South Asia was conducted in Varanasi. The objective of the meeting was to introduce the project and discuss the scope of activities to ensure that expectations of the city and objectives of the project are in sync with each other. The ICLEI South Asia team will train and guide sanitary staff for conducting quantification and characterisation of waste in ward no. 21.
