Greetings readers!

It is with great pride and pleasure that I share with you the success of the Local and Regional Governments Day, co-organised by United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) in partnership with ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability at UNCCD COP14 in Greater Noida last week. More than 100 participants from four continents, over 13 countries and 25 cities attended the session.

The presence of mayors and deputy mayors from Asia and Africa, members of civil society organisations, regional government officials and national representatives from India, South Africa, Burkina Faso and Niger, in addition to Spain, Sri Lanka, South Korea, Honduras and Mexico at the event is a measure of the growing concern over land degradation and its impact.

Their voices give us hope that the world is not fighting a losing battle. We shall feature a detailed article on the event in our next edition.

Among other positive developments, Chief Minister of Gujarat Shri Vijaybhai Rupani released the Climate Resilient City Action Plan (CRCAP) for Rajkot in August, as highlighted in this edition of e-news. The CRCAP addresses both climate mitigation and adaptation issues, and has been prepared under the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation-funded CapaCITIES project.

The need to think globally and act locally on climate resilience is now widely acknowledged. The participants of the country engagement workshops that we organised in Nepal, Bangladesh and India in August, as part of the Climate and Development Knowledge Network programme, also recognised the urgency to capacitate local authorities and to build synergy between stakeholders. Our efforts to capacitate local authorities is also reflected in our work in Sri Lanka, where we aim to develop a framework for Electric Mobility Policy, under Asia LEDS Partnership, following the first consultation meeting in Colombo last month.

We also have interesting updates from other ongoing projects in different parts of Asia. Read on to know about them!

# Gujarat CM Releases Climate Resilient City Action Plan for Rajkot

Chief Minister of Gujarat Shri Vijaybhai Rupani released the "Climate Resilient City Action Plan (CRCAP), Rajkot," prepared under the CapaCITIES project and supported by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC). Rajkot has taken the lead in addressing climate change-related issues at the city level, through various scientific studies and analysis. Its CRCAP addresses both climate mitigation and adaptation issues, and has the potential to reduce a total of 263,823 tonnes of  $\rm CO_2e$  GHG emissions by the year 2022-23. The Rajkot City Council adopted the CRCAP in February 2019, and has committed to reduce 14% of GHG emissions by 2022-23, as compared to the 2015-16 baseline of the city.

## CDKN Asia Organises Country Engagement Workshops in Nepal, Bangladesh and India

ICLEI South Asia, the Asia Regional Coordinator for Climate and Development Knowledge Network (CDKN) programme, organised national-level engagement workshops in Nepal, Bangladesh and India. The workshops discussed CDKN's activities in the three countries on the thematic priorities of the programme. They focused on identifying and addressing knowledge gaps at local, regional and national levels among various stakeholders, with the basic idea of identifying effective ways to disseminate knowledge on climate.

### **Delhi Puts Electric Vehicles on the Fast Track**

In a push to zero-emission vehicles in the National Capital, the transport department has initiated its Electric Vehicle Policy to kick-start its transition towards achieving 25% electric mobility by 2023. After several consultations with experts and stakeholders, the policy has been modified to focus more on electric two-wheelers and three-wheelers to provide clean, affordable and accessible last-mile connectivity. ICLEI South Asia provides technical assistance to develop low-carbon and electric mobility strategies for improving public transport to the transport department of Delhi.

# Pilot Wards to Showcase Urban95's ITCN Initiatives in Udaipur

Two pilot wards in Udaipur will showcase infant, toddler, caregiver-friendly neighbourhood (ITCN) infrastructure (social and physical) and services in the city under the Urban95 Programme. ICLEI South Asia is the technical partner for the Udaipur Municipal Corporation and the Bernard van Leer Foundation in the Urban95 programme. The process of identifying the wards involved a three-tiered, data-based analytical assessment, based on socio-economic factors (such as income, assets and availability of social infrastructure like PHCs, anganwadis, playschools, gardens and parks), and physical factors such as whether they had developed organically or in a planned manner.

# ALP Meeting Discusses Electric Mobility Policy Framework for Sri Lanka

Asia LEDS Partnership (ALP) organised the first consultation meeting in Colombo, to develop a framework for Sri Lanka's Electric Mobility Policy under its ongoing SDC-funded project. The primary aim of the meeting was to understand the ongoing and future plans of the Government of Sri Lanka to promote electric mobility in the country. The ALP team discussed the emissions scenario in the transport sector at the global, regional and country levels, and the different commitments made at national levels to control

emissions in various sectors. It also presented and discussed the current status of mobility and electric mobility in terms of modal split and travel pattern, along with the policies pertaining to/ promoting electric mobility in Sri Lanka.

# Pangi Landscape Study: Surveys to Identify Drivers of Degradation

Participatory rural appraisals and household surveys are being conducted in villages in the Pangi landscape, Himachal Pradesh. Biodiversity surveys are also being held along with participatory resource mapping. This is part of a United Nations Development Programmesupported study to define the extent and intensity of habitat degradation in the alpine and sub-alpine areas in the SECURE Himalaya project landscapes of Himachal Pradesh. The study will also identify the drivers of degradation and prepare a study proposal for developing a model mitigation plan.

# IAdapt Pilot Projects to Showcase Water Management Approaches in Solapur

Two pilot project interventions have been identified for Solapur district under the Integrated Rural Urban Water Management for Climate Based Adaptations in Indian Cities project, supported by the International Development Research Centre, Canada. A rainwater harvesting pilot will be implemented in Solapur city, and a constructed wetland for wastewater treatment pilot will be implemented in Tale Hipparga village, among other plans.
