Dear Readers,

As you may already know, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) recently released the Synthesis Report for the Sixth Assessment (AR6) on the state of the global climate. It summarises five years of reports on global temperature rises, fossil fuel emissions, and climate impacts. The report paints a stark picture of the current and future impacts of climate change and underscores the urgent need for action to mitigate its effects.

At ICLEI South Asia, we believe that local governments have a critical role to play in addressing the challenges posed by climate change. The IPCC Synthesis report confirms the need for urgent action at all levels of government, and local governments are uniquely placed to take bold and innovative steps to mitigate the effects of climate change and build resilience in their communities.

The report makes clear that the world is already experiencing the impacts of climate change, and that these impacts will worsen in the coming decades. The report underscores the urgent need for rapid and far-reaching reductions in greenhouse gas emissions to limit the increase in global temperatures to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels, and to achieve net-zero emissions by mid-century.

Local governments have a critical role to play in achieving these goals. We have been working closely with our members and partners to develop and implement ambitious climate action plans, increase the use of renewable energy sources, promote energy efficiency in buildings and transport systems.

We have also helped develop climate-resilient infrastructure, enhanced natural and green infrastructure, and developed early warning systems and emergency response plans which is an important aspect in adaptation to the impacts of climate change, which are already being felt in many parts of the world.

The report also highlights the importance of nature-based solutions in mitigating and adapting to the impacts of climate change. We have been working with cities across the region to promote urban green spaces, conserve and enhance biodiversity, and develop sustainable urban agriculture systems. These efforts not only help to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, but also provide a range of co-benefits, including improved air and water quality, and enhanced community well-being.

As we move forward into the year, we remain committed to supporting our members and partners in their efforts to address the challenges posed by climate change. We will continue to provide technical assistance, capacity building, and advocacy support to help cities across the region achieve their sustainability goals.

## शहरों में बिगड़ती हवा और बच्चों का स्वास्थ्य



हम सभी जानते हैं कि एक छोटा बच्चा किसी व्यस्क की तुलना में ज्यादा बार सांस लेता है। जहाँ एक व्यस्क एक मिनट में १२-१६ बार सांस लेता है, वहीँ ०५ साल का एक बच्चा इसके तीन से चार गुना अधिक बार सांस लेता है। उसके फेफड़े किसी व्यस्क की तुलना में अधिक कोमल होते हैं। बच्चों की लम्बाई कम होने से उनकी नाक धूल और प्रदूषण के ज्यादा करीब होती है। अब ज़रा कल्पना कीजिये कि हवा में मौजूद धूल और ज़हरीली गैसें किसी व्यस्क की तुलना में किसी बच्चे को कितना अधिक नुकसान पहुंचा सकती है? यहाँ तक कि मां के पेट में पल रहे शिशु भी इस बिगड़ती हवा से प्रभावित हो रहे हैं।
