ICLEI South Asia also participated in several sessions at the United Nations Biodiversity Conference (CBD COP 2024) at Columbia. This extends our commitment to nature centric development.

In this issue, you will discover highlights from some of our key projects aimed at building resilient and sustainable cities. From pioneering climate action initiatives to cutting-edge urban planning innovations, we are collectively shaping a greener, more climate-resilient future. Launch of U.S.-South Asia Mayoral Platform on Sustainable Cities

The U.S.-South Asia Mayoral Platform on Sustainable Cities was launched at the South Asia Clean Energy Forum in Jaipur on 22 October 2024. A collaboration between USAID and ICLEI offices in South Asia and USA through the SAREP program, this pioneering initiative connects mayors from the U.S. and South Asia, fostering the exchange of best practices and partnerships for sustainable urban development.



With 18 cities already on board, and more expected to participate in future collaborations, the platform facilitates knowledge sharing on resilient and green infrastructure, city-to-city partnerships to address urban challenges like waste management, public transportation, air quality, and climate impacts, and promotes clean energy solutions, including renewable energy and climate-sensitive urban planning. Together, these cities are paving the way toward a resilient, sustainable future!

GCAP 2024 Workshop: Climate Action Takes the Center Stage

The GCAP 2024 Workshop, held in Brazil from 2 to 5 October, 2024, saw the Asia LEDS Partnership (ALP) extend its momentum from the ALP Forum 2024 in Bangkok, which focused on advancing decarbonization in the Asia-Pacific region through enhanced NDCs and Long-Term Low-Emission Development Strategies (LT-LEDS). This three-day workshop emphasized strategic approaches to climate action and sustainable development, with a special focus on Asia across the first two days.



Participants at the workshop built on ALP Forum outcomes including strategizing on just transition considerations and solutions in Asia – transport, energy, and education sectors as well as technical and country considerations towards building up the green hydrogen supply chain.

GCAP members and others attendees engaged on collaboration across borders and sectors, including building data-driven, and holistic approaches to climate action.

CLARE Opportunity Fund Fuels Vital Projects in Asia!

Through the CLARE Opportunity Fund, two significant climate initiatives are gaining momentum in Asia. In order to enable officials at Provincial Municipal Learning Centers to establish gender-inclusive local adaptation plans of action, the Municipal Association (MuAN) in Nepal is creating a training manual and organising training programmes for all the PMLCs of Nepal.

The "Enhancing Local Capacities in Socially Inclusive Resilience in Asia (SIRA) Project," supported by Canada's IDRC and the UK's FCDO, is paving way for or more inclusive, climate-resilient urban development in Asia by incorporating voices from all community sectors, particularly those of underrepresented groups in resilience planning process. Aiming to strengthen the capacity of local governments and empower climate practitioners to undertake climate resilient actions, the project is actively working in Bangladesh, Nepal, the Philippines, and Indonesia.

This is a major milestone in our fight against climate change and in enhancing biodiversity. Our efforts have also expanded to Siliguri and Vadodara, strengthening our commitment to sustainable, green cities.



A Step Toward Sustainable Urban Ecosystems - Bangalore's City Biodiversity Index

ICLEI South Asia, in partnership with The University of Trans-Disciplinary Health Sciences and Technology (TDU), has developed the City Biodiversity Index for Bangalore, with funding from the Bengaluru Sustainability Forum. This index, known as the 'Singapore Index (SI)', is a self-assessment tool designed to monitor and evaluate biodiversity in urban areas.
