As the world confronts the impacts of climate change, a global consensus on 'Multisectoral Actions' is emerging for navigating these challenges. It advocates multilevel governance to address climate challenges and promote resilient, healthy urban environments.

The world in increasingly realising that tackling urban climate challenges effectively requires long-term integrated planning that spans across governance levels—from people, community, city, sub-national, to national and global leadership. The Multisectoral Actions Pathways (MAP) Declaration at COP29, which was endorsed by 150+ stakeholders, uniquely integrates nature-based solutions, disaster resilience, and green jobs into urban planning, and highlights how multilevel action is key to achieving sustainable climate solutions.

At this year's Daring Cities 2025 Bonn Dialogues, multilevel action took centre stage. The Dialogue reaffirmed ICLEI's commitment of empowering local governments for building sustainable, inclusive, and climate-resilient cities. Local actions, when aligned with national frameworks and supported by strong institutions, paves the way for transformative change.

Climate resilience has to be embedded into infrastructure, urban planning, and people's daily lives, and local governments have to be empowered with the tools, finance, and authority to act decisively. At ICLEI South Asia, we continue to advocate for this by working with cities and integrate scientific knowledge into action and support locally-driven, systemic solutions.

The intention to act is clear. Now is the time to empower it with the right partnerships, resources, and political will. Together, we can create equitable cities for all.

Kochi corp designs Rs 100-cr project to renovate

Pandarachira Canal

Kochi: Kochi corporation designed a Rs 100 crore project to rejuvenate Pandarachira Canal in West Kochi. The project is funded by Ocean Risk and Resilience Action Alliance (ORRAA), an international agency that works to build resilience in coastal communities and ecosystems.

Project to rejuvenate the canal, which passes through several divisions, will help address waterlogging in West Kochi area. "Integrated

Urban Regeneration and Water Transport System (IURWTS) project to rejuvenate six major canals in Kochi city is being implemented under the leadership of state govt. The plan involves removing silt from canals, constructing walls, implementing sewage system to avoid dumping of faecal waste into these waterbodies, purifying water, improving side roads and installing lights to enhance beauty of the area," mayor M Anilkumar said.

"Canals in West Kochi are not included in this project. In this context, the idea of rejuvenating Pandarachira Canal, one of the main canals in West Kochi region, was proposed and it was decided to implement the project in collaboration with international agencies such as ICLEI South Asia, Bechtel and Swiss Re," Anilkumar said.

The project includes a treatment plant to process polluted water currently flowing into Pandarachira Canal.
